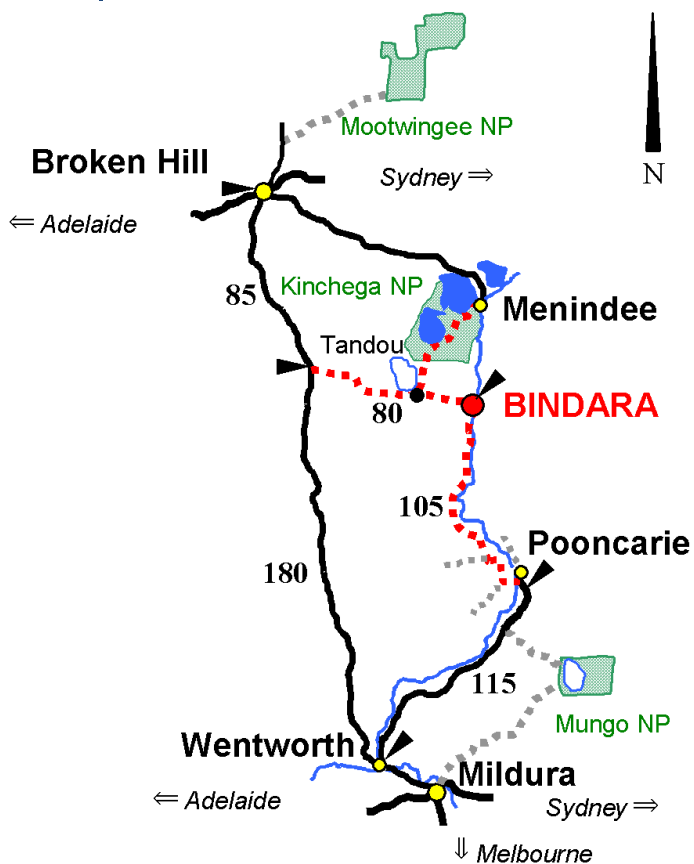
## PHOTOGRAPHIC TRIP TO LAKE MUNGO & BROKEN HILL

## MINI WORKSHOP – ORGANISER PAULA DEBARROS

Paula has asked me to pass on the following information regarding the pre-cut frames she spoke about at the recent Mini Workshop.

These can be obtained at Picture Framing material Supplies, 1A Birmingham Ave, Villawood 2163. Phone: 9726 0020. (On the corner of Christina and Birmingham).

These are the sizes we buy our frames as I mentioned at the presentation recently. Picture Framing Material Supplies in Villawood does 6 per board and each board is around \$20.

The advantage is I can print on an A4 and reuse the frames.

All outside size 400mm x 300mm and same for backing foam.

These all to be in Landscape orientation with the window centered

window size 264mm x 176mm

window size 264mm x 132mm

window size 264mm x 88mm

These to be in Portrait orientation with the window offset 80mm from top but centered on the horizontal

window size 170mm x 170mm
